When Calling to Report an Emergency



- Give the precise location of the incident/victim.
- Clearly state your name and telephone number.
- Wait for confirmation that your message has been understood.
- Meet, or send someone to meet, the Emergency Service at the appropriate building entrance.

Evening & Weekend Building Security

Report any security concerns immediately to Campus Security on 88188.

Please do not grant anyone access to the Complex, e.g. by 'swiping' them in through a secure door, unless they can prove they have a valid reason for being here.

Fire Procedure



- On hearing a continuous siren, leave by the nearest fire exit and follow the green & white exit signs out of the building.
- Do not use the lifts.
- Report to the Assembly Point.

Fire Procedure



- If you discover a fire, do not attempt to tackle it unless it is safe to do SO.
- Raise the alarm by hitting the nearest break-glass and leave by the nearest fire exit.

First Aid



- Every First Aid box within the Complex contains a list of CLS First Aiders.
- Campus Security staff are also trained to provide First Aid and can be called outwith normal working hours.

Lone Working

Make sure someone knows exactly when and where you are working.

Keep a fully charged mobile phone and Emergency Numbers Card (available from Reception) with you at all times.

Avoid high risk activities.

Children on CLS Premises

- The parent/guardian must provide strict and close supervision at all times.
- The following areas are deemed unsuitable for children:
 - any laboratory area;
 - writing rooms off laboratory areas;
 - workshops;
 - waste collection/disposal areas;
 - stores facilities and loading/delivery bays;
 - goods lifts;
 - basement areas.

Travelling through these unsuitable areas to reach a low risk area is also unacceptable.

General Lab Safety

- Do not smoke, drink, eat or apply cosmetics within laboratory areas.
- Ensure that any spills are cleaned up quickly, carefully and thoroughly.
- Take great care when working with naked flames and other ignition sources.

General Lab Safety



 You must wash your hands thoroughly if contamination is suspected, after removing gloves and immediately prior to leaving the laboratory area.

- When working within a laboratory area you must wear a fastened, long-sleeved lab coat.
- Wear appropriate clothing to protect the parts of the body not covered by your lab coat.

- Wear gloves if there is risk of coming into contact with a hazardous substance.
- Watch out for signs of dermatitis or allergic reaction to the glove material.
- Remove your gloves before leaving the lab or touching door handles, phones, computer keyboards, etc. used by people not wearing gloves.

- Wear safety glasses when there is risk of accidental contamination of the eyes.
- In some cases goggles may be more appropriate.
- Wear a face shield when the entire face requires protecting.

- Wear appropriate footwear when working in the lab, i.e. shoes or boots that fully cover the toes and feet.
- High heels are not appropriate for the lab environment.

- Respiratory protective equipment (RPE) should only be worn if inhalation cannot be prevented by other means.
- Anyone wearing RPE should be facefit tested to ensure it gives adequate protection.
- The filter must be of the correct type.
- Remember, RPE only protects the wearer and others working in the immediate vicinity may still be at risk.

- Ear defenders should only be worn if noise cannot be reduced by other means.
- A good fit is essential.
- Remember, ear defenders only protect the wearer and others working in the immediate vicinity may still be at risk.
